

- Question 1) The special provision for item 114.1 states Demolition of portions of the existing substructure shall be paid for under Item 127.1 Reinforced Concrete Excavation. The special provision for item 127.1 seems as if it was written for a different project. This special provision for item 127.1 includes statements such as "Note: Some of the bridges, due to their height..." This special provision discusses cleaning, cutting and bending of existing reinforcement to be retained. A quick review of the plans shows drilled grouted dowels and new reinforcement steel. This special provision also discusses how to perform full depth brick deck excavations. The Basis of Payment for this special provision includes the removal of the bituminous concrete and waterproofing membrane. Could you please review the special provision for item 127.1 and make any revisions you feel are necessary?
- Response 1) See revised pages A00801 43 and 44.
- Question 2) 4000psi 3/8 inch concrete is to be used for repairs to the face of the existing concrete. Item 905 4000 PSI 3/8 Inch 660 Cement Concrete includes 20CY of concrete. The special provision for Item 995 includes 14CY of 4000psi 3/8 inch concrete in the Schedule of Basis for Partial Payment. Could you please review these items and make any changes you feel are necessary. If no changes are to be made could you please clarify what the two different items are to be used for?

- Question 3) Please refer to sheet 13 of 25 of the bridge drawings. It appears that the proposed precast highway guardrail transitions are going to conflict with the existing abutment sections that are to remain. Please provide additional details regarding these proposed guardrail transitions and how they will tie-in to the existing abutment.

Question 4) Please refer to sheet 23 of 25 of the bridge drawings, detail: "Precast Guardrail Transition Plan at NW, SW, and NE Corners." It doesn't appear that this detail matches the curtain wall layouts shown on the abutment drawings, particularly on the SW and NE Corners. At the SW and NE Corners, it appears the curtain walls extend beyond the limits of the existing abutment at the demolition limit. Please clarify and provide further details on these curtain walls.

order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular

rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local),

a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate

(weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed

in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or

""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were

prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of

the union which prevailed in the survey for this

classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198

indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number,

005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing

the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the

most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing

this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that

no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and

the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average

rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates

the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates

the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007

in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion

date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a

new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union

average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in

the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage

determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date

for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of

each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SA"" identifier indicate that

the prevailing wage rate set by a state (or local) government

was adopted under 29 C.F.R \diamondsuit 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007

01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME

refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the

state completed the survey on which the listed classifications

and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an

internal number used in producing the wage determination. 01/03/2024 reflects the date on which the classifications and

rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in

the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on
 - a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests

for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for

the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described

in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

ITEM 127.1 REINFORCED CONCRETE EXCAVATION

CUBIC YARD

The work under this Item shall conform to the relevant provisions of Subsection 140 of the Standard Specifications and the following.

No demolition shall commence until Temporary Protective Shielding in accordance with Item 994.01 of these specifications is in place and accepted by the Engineer.

Sawcuts shall be utilized at perimeter of all concrete removal limits where removal is adjacent to existing concrete to remain. Sawcut depth shall be 3/4".

Reinforced Concrete Excavation shall include the concrete excavation at abutments including portions of the wingwalls as shown on the plans and as required by the Engineer. Reinforced Concrete Excavation shall progress as per the approved construction sequence.

Small chipping hammers, weighing no more than 30 pounds, shall be used within 6" of sawcuts as shown on the plans.

During the prosecution of this work, the Engineer may reject the use of any method or equipment that causes undue vibration or possible damage to the remaining structure or any part thereof.

The Contractor shall take care not to damage any portion of the existing structure to remain. Any damage caused by the Contractors operations shall be repaired as required by the Engineer at the Contractor's expense.

The contractor shall recognize the age of this bridge and shall use caution during this work so as to not damage portions to remain. Should damage occur, the contractor will be responsible for repairing those portions to the approval of the Engineer, at no additional cost.

METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

Item 127.1 will be measured for payment by the Cubic Yard of reinforced concrete excavated.

BASIS OF PAYMENT

Item 127.1 will be paid for at the Contract unit price per Cubic Yard, which price shall include all design, bracing, shoring, testing, loading, transportation, disposal fees, permitting, labor, tools, equipment, materials, and all incidental costs required to complete the work.
